For PDI the board will pay half of the room, there is no charge if you get a roommate on the board

We adhere to the budget, we do not spend \$225 for example if there was only \$200 approved for it. The president can approve if \$250 within over budget

Joette explained our Profit and Loss Statements and our Balance Sheet, she provided handouts

Quick PDI Report

- 100 more people at PDI than last year
- Joette can determine a breakdown of attendance by members, retirees and Student Teacher, she can also break it down as attendees per county
- Districts 3 (Wake) and 6 (Mecklenburg) are always the largest attendees
- From District 2 and 4 we have more people coming than we had members
- District Directors need to focus on the largest city or county in your district
- PDI has seen decreased numbers as a result of the Bridging The Gap and NCTIES conference, along with budget cuts and the loss of the Eisenhower Funds.
- We have seen an increase in vendor numbers and we had a full Exhibit Hall, this is something for us to be very proud of

Discussion of Budget Motion.....

Balance the budget, anything left goes to the bank and this can back up our savings Conference budget spent \$132,212.00 and \$131,164.21 was budgeted, very close, as close as we have been recently

There are several things this year to pay for where we have not in recent pass, Sched app and the I-Contact, we had been using the DPI license for the Sched App for our PDI, that license increased substantially for them so have to pay that, I-Contact now charges \$600, so this represents a new expense to the budget

History, there were two years of COVID without income from PDI so we had to do Virtual conferences twice and made about \$7,000 charging \$30 to non-members, members attended free, we were in a hole of \$86,000 plus because of no conference, we had to go into our savings, we try to do our very best with negotiating with Benton Convention Center for the facilities to hold our PDI, we try to carpool if possible and share rooms, in years past we had 4 face-to-face meetings throughout the calendar year. During Covid, we had to meet via Zoom, this year we will only meet 2 face-to-face meetings, 3 were asked for but only 2 budgeted. Travel reimbursements increase cost for face-to-face meetings. Our PDI is not included as a budgeted meeting as we are expected to be there

This past year there was a \$250 President's Reception in the President's Suite, it was part of our \$15,000 food obligation

Some vendors paid for some of the session lunches, also, increase of attendees ups the food cost.

Plaques are budgeted higher

Grants/Study Grants remained the same as budgeted

Nametags, low cost, we can wear these while representing NCSTA at conferences, etc.

Adrienne took care of these

Storage rental increased this year

- 2. Executive committee moves to change the exhibitor booth policy by eliminating the free conference registrations for each paid booth (A. Evans), Manley amended to say by eliminating the free conference registration, motion carries
- 3. Executive Committee Motion.....The Executive Committee moves to approve the presidential appointment of an Ad Hoc Committee for establishing written criteria for the Vi Hunsucker & Lifetime Achievement Awards (A. Evans)
- 4. PDI Committee
 - PDI Committee moves to adopt the revised sponsorship levels for vendors as follows: Bronze-\$1500, Platinum \$5000, Silver \$2500, Gold \$3500, and Diamond \$10,000; Amended a Emerald Level \$20,000+
 - PDI Committee moves to make the following changes to our vendor fees: mailing list of
 participants \$200 and commercial sessions (commercial presentations) for a session
 during the PDI \$150. Rationale: We have not increased these fees in several years
 while other fees have increased. Sponsorships local to come to PDI \$500 covers
 registration, room, sub, etc..
