Sections I-VI were highlighted with page numbers, not something to memorize but to be familiar with. Purpose of our organization was mentioned to highlight ALL FIELDS OF SCIENCE

It was discussed how quorum was met with the majority of the Executive Board and 5 out of 8 District Directors in attendance. Without a quorum, no votes can be taken.

Carol went over Robert's Rules of Order Parliamentary Procedure (newly revised)

Communicate throughout your district, particularly at student competitions in February and March with Science Olympiads, Robotics, Envirothons, etc.

Adrienne Evans asked if we would need to have badge identifiers to help identify us, this is networking to our organization, it is also a way to get teachers, principals and leadership from the County involved in science

- Minutes from the last meeting were approved (motion made by Mary Ellen and seconded by Carol

Treasurer's Report (Carol Maidon)

- We are not in the red for one of the first times since the pandemic due to increased attendance from PDI contributions from our board, we promoted our PDI and it paid dividends.
- Joette and Manley helped increase funds from our vendors that led to more contributions. They do and excellent job conversing with our exhibitors and vendors. Manley made many phone calls, we had multiple food event sponsors, board sponsorships and Joette matching monies for the reception. Mary Ellen revived the Reflector with many mentions of previewing the PDI. The Beginning Teacher's Workshop on Friday was a success. In addition the new Science Standard sessions were a real draw. Having increased our registration fee in slight increments gave us a little extra funds as well. We are only 10 months from our next PDI. PDI's take everyone pulling together.

NCSTA Treasurer Report

As of December 31, 2024, the North Carolina Science Teachers Association received an income of \$152,150.96. The total expenses as of the end of December were \$122,176.05 thus yielding a net income of \$29,974.91. The association's assets are \$56,170.24 in two checking accounts and \$74,795.98 in three saving accounts.

Business Manager's Report (Joette Midgett)

PDI Recap.....

- 2022 328 attendees, 2023 469 attendees
- No printed program
- 56 booths, split between Commercials and Non-Profits
- Use of Sched
- Full rooms for Lunch & Learn sessions
- Selling of our attendee list, we had 6 vendors pay for that, that generated revenue
- Plasma Games, big sponsor, need to approach them again
- Districts 3 and 5 had the highest attendees
- Joette reviewed the organization's reimbursement policies: State rate is 67 cents per mile, these forms are on the Google Drive, the forms are fillable/printable and can be done online. Board members can request a motel room for meetings if they travel more than 3 hours, need to give heads up for state rates, always encourage carpooling and sharing of rooms if coming from the same area to save costs. For the PDI mileage is reimbursed and if board members find a roommate, NCSTA covers ½ of the room. Reminder-all board members have to register for the PDI. She reviewed what constitutes free memberships: executive board members and District Directors
- We need to represent NCSTA at various meetings, our presence is vital.
- We need to follow our budget very carefully, don't buy stuff and expect to get reimbursed, there are rules if you are over budget on line items. If less than \$200, the president will make a decision and give input, more than \$200 per line item requires a board vote.
- Forms are again on the Google Drive in the Official NCSTA folder for travel and Non-Travel, need receipts to get reimbursed
- Joette reminded us with the board@emails to put your name at the end of your correspondence so we know who it is coming from (the reply). If you need to send something to an individual board member, don't use board@
- We post blurbs on our website with pertinent information such as Awards, competitions, nominations, mini-grants, etc. By the way, the deadline for Awards is May 31st.
- We use a software package called ISoftware, this goes to all members, can get caught in SPAM.

Conference Coordinator Report (Manley Midgett)

- No contract with UNC-G for our PDI in November yet, ballrooms have to be catered by UNC-G
- Not sure about dimensions for Exhibitors

- Parking on the College campus, whole floor? Will the arm be up? Getting conflicting information
- This week there was to be imposed a 28% administrative fee, that was the reason we wanted to go to this location because that was not supposed to happen
- Not trustworthy of the information from the UNC-G contact
- Decision to return to Benton Convention Center in Winston-Salem is on the table after this turn of events, will be talking with them on Monday at 10:15 a.m..
- Discussion of Monday thru Wednesday timeframe for PDI, young teachers not willing to give up a Saturday so a Friday-Saturday conference not really plausible. Brad Rhew asked about this. Lottie Peppers asked about sending out a survey regarding a weekend conference, County's ESSER funds are beginning to run out this year.
- Reminder that Benton Convention Center is all on one floor, easier signage, navigation.
- This coming PDI is the "Year of The Rocks."
- Sandra made a motion to negotiate with Benton and give Manley the authority to get best dates.
- MOTION....by Sandra Weitzel Move to allow Conference Planner to enter into negotiations with Benton Convention Center in lieu of UNC-G for the 2024 NCSTA Conference. Carol Maidon seconded this motion, passed unanimously.
- Monday to Wednesday of the originally planned week are open, vendor setup would be Sunday with the Conference being Monday and Tuesday. It was mentioned that there is greater substitute availability earlier in the week than later in the week. 1st choice would be November 6-8, 2nd Choice Monday-Tuesday or Tuesday/Wednesday
- We will need to have an emergency meeting to discuss a contract and amending the budget
- Our contract with Benton was signed pre-COVID so it would likely be different now, they
 had not replaced us on their schedule of dates for conference, so this is a good sign.
 Tuesday of the week of November 4th is election day, there is a conflict with the original
 date of November 6-8, 2024 at Benton

Action Items

NCSTA Budget for Operating Year (Carol Maidon and Joette Midgett)

- Proposed budget was sent out with the 2023 and 2022 budget listed for comparison
- Motion from the Finance Committee to approve the 2024 budget, no second needed, discussion followed
- Thanks to Brad Rhew and Mary Ellen Durham helped with this budget
- Question was asked about badges in the budget, we can find some between \$3 and \$10 without pins
- If we move back to Benton, there will likely be changes and a revised budget, would need to have this meeting by March

- In the budget, mailings and postage has increased from last year, Sandra Weitzel added that money budgeted for attendance at Middle and Elementary Conferences were worth the travel because of increased revenue as we saw last year.
- There is a line item for Updating/Redesigning our NCSTA logo.
- Joette's site visits line-item will decrease if we abandon going to UNC-G and return to Benton, the facility site will increase, food will increase and signage line-item will drop
- The Finance Committee will meet again and present changes to this budget.
- Motion to approve the current 2024 budget passes.

2024 PDI Themes/Strands

- Cliff Hudson sent and email to Tom with revisions at the bottom, these have already been voted on, wordsmithing was done on the 2nd strand
- Sandra approves the verbiage do bullets instead of commas when put on the website.

Discussion Items

- District Directors communicate with the Reflector to update events, etc. This is an
 opportunity to get members on sub committees to bring them on board for leadership.
 This is part of the teacher evaluation process. Chairpersons appoint their own
 committee members. Goal of ours is to know the names for people who in your county
 are county liaisons for Science Education.
- Mary Ellen Durham shared how much of a challenge the Reflector was as she started but she has made it great with contributions from her fellow board members. She expressed that she has learned the format through Canva account. When she began she promised Cliff 2-3 issues and she was responsible or 4. This year there has been 5, two special editions one pre and the other post-PDI. The most recent Reflector edition featured many pictures from this past PDI. Lots of contacts have resulted which is good PR for us. Carie Fugle is to be commended for taking great pictures, great opening rate on the electronic issue of the Reflector. It's a good tool to recruit members, get back old members, alert County supervisors and principals. Word of mouth of this goes a long way, the word is getting out quickly about NCSTA and its influence across the state
- There are comments that the Reflector's teaching tips and lesson plans are the most popular items. So good to hear what people that got grants did with it, they shared on the publication. Science teacher, Dorothy Holley, was mentioned for having recurring articles, we are celebrating what members, teachers and their students are doing in their classrooms.
- Mary Ellen shared a tentative schedule for publications: 1st week of February next electronic edition, then late April, late Summer as a preview of PDI
- NCSELA Summit is next Friday and Science Olympiad is next Saturday, February 3rd
- Ann McClung was mentioned as "Queen of Robotics" for her work the last 17 years with this program. There is a link to Pitt County Schools on its website for the podcast devoted to her work. We can spotlight anyone, even board members
- 3 ways to get the word out about NCSTA (Newsletter, Facebook/Social Media and our website)

 District Directors shared what was going on in their districts with various competitions and their dates. Dates for the NC Envirothon were mentioned for each region of the state

- Membership Outreach: Middle School Level Conference is March 24-26, presentations are in the budget for this, tout being a member at this conference, social media tags
- UNC-W CSTEM Conference and Building Engineers Conference K-5 at the McKimmon Center on April 26th

Nominations (Josh Hunter)

- Odd Districts are up for elections this year, need to possibly change our election process; President says, "do you want to run again?" We don't want to have an election where predominantly only one person is running for each office.
